A message from Duncan

It has been good to have one or two conversations following on from our time with the Beatitudes last Sunday (Matthew 5.1-11). They're pretty challenging and difficult to comprehend aren't they. They are sometimes described as Jesus' introduction to the upside-down kingdom he is inaugurating. That's a good description because it feels to me like trying to recognise a picture that is upside down. We struggle to work out what is being depicted because all the normal reference points are not where our brain is used to seeing them. So we end up straining our necks and getting into an awkward position in order to make sense of what we are seeing.

And it will continue to feel awkward as we move through the Sermon on the Mount. Many of the normal reference points in life, things that we thought made sense, are turned on their head. So I wanted to encourage you to keep going. Also, to let you in on the fact that I share the discomfort as well. Each time I come back to these verses, well-known by many of us, it feels as though I am a novice. And that's a good thing in some ways. God often has to strip back our previous understanding in order to build a truer understanding for the next phase in our life of discipleship.

It's like knitting - and I know a thing or two about knitting - literally a thing or two - particularly when you are learning. You make some good progress only to notice, when you take a pause, that there are some missed stitches a few lines back. You could plough on regardless but the eventual project will be misshapen. Or you could unpick some of the rows so you can start again and develop a truer reflection of the pattern you are trying to follow.

As this collection of Jesus' teaching is so foundational in the life of a disciple, it is worth taking some time to do the unpicking, start afresh and...get knitting!

Collect for the Fourth Sunday of Epiphany


God our creator,
