### ***A message from Duncan***

We have looked together at the first three 'makarios' statements of Jesus' introduction to the Sermon on the Mount. They are a strange, unexpected description of who is experiencing the good life of the Kingdom of Heaven. The first three consider the types of people Jesus is drawing our attention to: the wrung out and resource-lite, those who grieve this state and its impact on 'rightness' of our lives and our world, and those who have no influence to do much about it. Then he will describe the result of their Kingdom formation into people who reach hungrily for a world in which right relationships have been restored, and who act towards others in accord with this vision - embodying merciful love, with a whole of life integrity that harmonises our words, actions and the motivations of the heart. Finally he describes the consequence of this formation - these kind of people will be peacemakers, persecuted and misrepresented.

Well this is my attempt anyway at making sense of Jesus' beatitudes, helped very much by others. But rather than the content of the last paragraph forming my message to you today, it is the process I would like to draw your attention to before we move on. The process of re-articulation is an important part of deepening our understanding of scripture. Putting something into our own words really helps Jesus' teaching sink into our lives. Even when we know our words are insufficient and in need of constant revision, the effort and process is really valuable. It is an important part of what the Psalmist means when he says that the one who knows the good life is the one who "*delights in the law of the Lord, and on his law he meditates day and night.*" (Psalm 1). And surprisingly, like the good life of the Kingdom, meditation is not reserved for the intellectual, or academic or those interested in theological discourse. Indeed, they might well find themselves at a disadvantage if the principles of the upside-down kingdom is anything to go by. It is for all who simply love the Lord, who think of him and his words as they do the dishes, or walk the dog, or paint their latest piece of art, or chat with a friend.

As we devote ourselves, in some measure, to this discipline during Lent we are assured that something grows in us, or rather we grow *“like a tree planted by streams of water, that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither.”*

And thinking of growing things puts me in mind of Spring, but that’s for another time. For now, grace and peace be with you all,

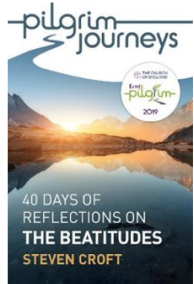

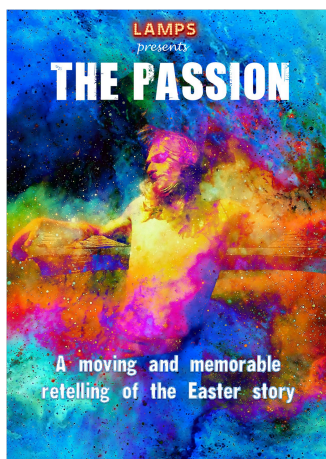
