#### A message from Duncan

How good is life for those who show mercy, because they will be shown mercy.

Matthew 3.7 (BibleProject translation)

After our Mothering Sunday diversion, we return to the Beatitudes to consider acts of mercy. In our childhood years we use the word 'mercy' to demonstrate our submission to a friend who has us in an inescapable wrestle hold! Perhaps pleading for mercy from a judge when we have been found guilty is a more grown up version! But that is not the idea here! The Hebrew word behind the greek word is "Hesed". (Its one of the few Hebrew words I actually know along with house [Beth] and bread [lehem]!) You will recognise its frequent use in the Hebrew scriptures by its translation: 'loving kindness' or 'steadfast love'. So 'mercy' can be described as generous and overreaching acts of love. It is the kind of love that Jesus said should mark his disciples (John 13.35) because we have experienced this exact kind of loving action from God himself (1 John 4:19). It is also the natural response of the one who, from the previous beatitude, hungers and thirsts after right-relationships in our world. Rather than thinking that our uninfluential and small efforts are fruitless and worth nothing, we add our small acts of loving kindness to God's great conspiracy to overturn evil with good. It is our little rebellion in our often cynical world. It is our secret and confident demonstration that God's way of love will win the day. It seems logical to think that the rock will crush the fragile plant, but the reality is that in the fullness of time the plant cracks the rock. As someone once said, love wins.

I celebrate the many ways in which I see this at work in the life of our churches and also realise that most simple and profound acts of mercy remain unseen. So my only encouragement is keep going and don't give up! Though our acts of loving kindness seem insignificant in light of the problems of this world, God's way of love *will* win the day and we get to join in!


