A message from Duncan

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" John 21.15

Breakfast on the beach was a turning point.

It's a bit like when we are reunited with beloved family members or friends after a long absence, or after we have enjoyed a great success or achievement; perhaps it's a bit like a wedding day. There are wonderful moments of euphoria and overflowing expressions of shared joy, but eventually it all calms down a little - it has to - and we begin to work out what life is like in the wake of the big event.

I wonder whether it was a bit like that on the beach. Peter had leapt out of the boat, others were marvelling at the catch of fish, thrilled to see Jesus, no doubt a hubbub of conversation over the morning fire. But eventually, Jesus takes Peter to one side. All the disciples, particularly Peter, need to work out what life is going to be like in the wake of the big event. And in view of everything that lies in the future for them he asks the critical question: "Do you love me?"

Obviously Peter had particular reasons to hear that question. He needed the gentle but firm restoration of Jesus. But we all need to hear the same question ourselves. It stands at the beginning of our pilgrim journey, and it remains at the centre of our ongoing life with God everyday. If our love for Jesus is not at the heart of it all our Christian life will be cold, wet drudgery and joyless. With love for him as our foundation, our reason, our anchor, we can weather the fiercest storms with unstoppable hope.

So as we continue into Spring and the rest of the year, let's take a moment to reflect on our love for Jesus. Does it stand at the centre of our everyday? Do we want it to? As we draw closer to Pentecost do we need to pray for the work of the Holy Spirit to:

kindle a flame of sacred love
upon the mean altar of my heart,
there let it for thy glory burn
with inextinguishable blaze,
and trembling to its source return,
in humble prayer and fervent praise.
