A message from Duncan

"The Good life belongs to the powerless for theirs is the kingdom of the skies"

Matthew 5.3 (Bible Project Translation)

It's a striking translation, isn't it. There's no avoiding the radical and disorientating teaching of Jesus. We are more used to "the poor in spirit", which is too easily cloaked in religious overtones. The 'spirit', in Hebrew thinking, is our life-force. So Jesus is saying that those who are at the end of themselves (impoverished in life-force), lacking drive, energy and the necessary 'ommph' to make things happen in this world for themselves, at the end of their rope - much like the crowd that stood before him (Matt 4.24) - they are in a state of blessedness, they are in a good place, for theirs is the kingdom in heaven.

I'm still struggling to work this out. I have more questions than answers. But I have been struck that there are plenty of people amongst us who do feel like this themselves - dear brothers and sisters who struggle daily with chronic fatigue, debilitating illness for a brief or longer period, the profound limitations of old age, stubborn depression, financial anxiety, severe loneliness. I have shared in some of these myself, as I expect we all have for differing lengths of time. Our tendency, quite rightly, is to pray for swift recovery, healing and provision. After all, that is what Jesus did for the crowd before him. But Jesus seems to be saying much more - that such experiences and states of being will open you up to the Kingdom of Heaven - to God's way of doing things, to God's way of thinking to which we are to align our own thinking (Matt 4.17).

I'm not suggesting we should stop praying for healing for one another. It is perfectly biblical to do so. But perhaps we should encourage one another to lean in - to lean into the suffering that impoverishes our spirit in order that we might grasp something more of the Kingdom of heaven - a deeper insight, a more profound experience of God. For, according to Jesus, we are clearly in the perfect place at such times to be able to do so.

Whatever you are going through at the moment, and the struggles you live with, my prayer is that you would reach out to receive the Good life of the Kingdom of Heaven as you trust in the one who specialises in turning mourning to dancing.



The role involves arranging visits for groups to come and stay in our comfortable retreat centre or at the Adventure Base in Oxfordshire. Click here for more information.


Open Morning at The King's School, Witney
