A message from Duncan

"How good is life for those who grieve, because they will be comforted."

Matthew 5.4 (Bible Project Translation)

Who is experiencing the Good Life? Who is at the centre of what God is doing in this world? According to Jesus it is those who are powerless, at the end of themselves with no resources to change things, theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven. It is also those who are well acquainted with grief in this world. As we approach the season of Lent this is particularly relevant, for Lent is a time when we allow ourselves to lean into the darkness of our hearts and the darkness of this world. It's not an easy or comfortable time, and is quite out of step with this world. It is also out of step with the Christian culture many of us have come from. Evangelical funerals have often been quite colourful affairs, and I understand why, and am equally pleased to celebrate a life lived for Christ and the certain hope of resurrection, as long as we take time to lean into the tragedy of bereavement as well, of the condition that humanity finds itself in, and that touches our lives in profound ways. Jesus, leads the way in this as he weeps at the graveside of his beloved friend. And it must have been an obvious display of grief as those around him comment, "See how he loved him" (John 11.36). He knew joy was just round the corner but in that moment he leaned into his grief, into the tragedy that there is a "burial shroud that enfolds all peoples, the veil that is spread over all nations" (Isaiah 25.7). He also tells us that those who grieve this tragedy of sin and death amongst the blessed ones who will be comforted.

I know, I'm still trying to work it out myself -Jesus' topsy-turvy kingdom. But this Lent is an opportunity to learn. Homegroups, and specifically formed groups (see

below), are invited to learn from the persecuted church how to grieve, how to practise the biblical instinct to lament in God's presence. Ash Wednesday is also an opportunity to take a moment to lean uncomfortably into our mortality and our propensity towards evil and grieve. It will feel even more out of joint this year as the day will be shared by the festival of St.Valentine. But maybe there is something in that. For we do not meditate on these things to despair at the darkness, but to see and welcome the light.


LENT RESOURCES



The role involves arranging visits for groups to come and stay in our comfortable retreat centre or at the Adventure Base in Oxfordshire. Click here for more information.


Open Morning at The King's School, Witney
