A message from Duncan

'while they still did not believe it because of joy and amazement, he asked them, "Do you have anything here to eat?" Luke 24.41

I love the season of Eastertide in which we get the opportunity to reflect on the resurrection narratives for a while. After the busyness of Holy Week and Easter weekend has subsided we get the time and space to actually enjoy and delight in the strangeness of the events that lie at the heart of our faith. In home communions this week I have been sharing the Easter evening narrative from the end of Luke's gospel. I have been struck by numerous thoughts but the verse above keeps rising to the surface of my reflections, though I still don't know how to make sense of it (I mean - did you notice it literally doesn't make sense!). I guess that reflects the feeling in that room - a chaos of confusion and emotion and unarticulated questions, hopes and doubts, along with the ensuing destruction of category distinctions in the disciple's minds, into which Jesus asserts that, after destroying death, conquering the grave and crippling evil, he is getting a little peckish! It is a beautiful conjunction of the sublime and the ordinary. It reflects the truth that Jesus is both the Risen one with the name above all names and, at the same time, terribly down to earth! It is a tension we are to leave unresolved in our own relationship with him. He is the Lord and High Priest of the cosmos without whom nothing can exist, before whom we bow, even tremble. He is also the one who promised, in the upper room before his death, that he and the eternal Father would come and make their home with the one who loved him and obeyed his teachings (John 14.23). Amazing! Like the resurrection narratives themselves, you couldn't make it up.

We are the inheritors of these glorious truths, and, in this season of Eastertide, I ask that you would join me to pray that we might see others in our lives and communities meet the Risen Lord. It is too good not to share somehow, as we, in a very real, but mysterious way, "are witnesses of these things." (Lk 24.48)

The Diocese will join together to remember the Rt Revd Dr Alan Wilson this Saturday, 13 April, at 11.30am.


