# A message from Duncan

By the time you read this, we will know the result of the General Election. In the run up to the big day it's been very helpful to spend extended time with others praying this week, and it's probably a good idea for us all to keep praying as MPs, particularly those who are serving for the first time, settle into the strange routines of Westminster, as well as for the elected government as they turn from the slogans of campaign to the stark reality of the challenges they face.

During our prayer times we used readings and prayers from the Daily Office, and they were particularly relevant for the week. We began on Monday with a welcome reminder from Psalm 99 that, whilst the various parties and candidates vie for power in this land, it is ultimately the Lord who is King. And the New Testament reading demonstrated that God's powerful rule is exercised through one who is humble and riding on a donkey (Luke 19.28-40). Tuesday got quite political as Hannah sang her song of praise which one day Mary would imitate whilst carrying the Messiah in her womb. Yahweh is the one who *"raises the poor from the dust; he lifts the needy from the ash heap"* (1 Samuel 2.8). There is no doubting the contents of God's manifesto! On Wednesday Psalm 146 exhorted us to *"Put not your trust in princes, nor in any human power"*. We will pray for and honour those who are elected to govern but they will make many mistakes and not every policy will prove to be prudent or wise. It is inevitable. It would be helpful if those who govern would be willing to admit this every so often.

But I was most moved by the Collect for the week from the Book of Common Prayer (5th Sunday after Trinity). It seemed to be amazingly relevant, almost as though this was the reason Rishi Sunak called the election for this week! So I trust you will join me in continuing to pray: GRANT, O Lord, we beseech thee, that the course of this world may be so peaceably ordered by thy governance, that thy Church may joyfully serve thee in all godly quietness; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
