A message from Duncan

Life can be a roller coaster.

Journalists have traditionally dreaded August as a slow month in which there is nothing much happening to write about. If it was ever true, it certainly isn't in our day. We are taken from the thrill and triumph of Olympic competition to the reality of heartbreaking tragedy and ensuing riots on our streets, then to the devastating consequences of international conflict that seems ever poised to erupt ever more widely, then to the long term consequences of unchecked industrialisation. And we must not forget the emotional and circumstantial contours of our own lives that can, at times, be overwhelming enough. We move from tears and sadness, to celebration and joy, to frustration, fear and anxiety all in a week.

The early church lived in a world with its fair share of ups and downs. And amidst it all Paul recommended to the church in Thessalonica, *"Make it your ambition to lead a quiet life" 1 Thessalonians 4.11.* It is a regular 'go to' verse for me although I am still weighing exactly what Paul is saying, and not always making much progress in its application. I don't think he is encouraging us not to care, or be aware of what is happening around us, or even be moved by it. We are called to live lives of compassion reflecting Jesus' own heart that was moved by the plight of the people he met and acted to address their needs. Rather, he is speaking of a life that is so steadied by the ballast of faith, that though the rollercoaster throws us around corners, up to heights and down to depths, there remains a stillness within; a profound trust that God is in control. It may really, really seem that he is not at times, that things have finally escaped from his grasp. But the quiet heart trusts. It has gathered the evidence, evaluated the data, encountered the Author, his goodness and love, and holds a steady course.
