A message from Duncan

Last Sunday felt like a birthday celebration. I know it wasn't an official anniversary but it was lovely to remember the beginning of the Church in Europe as we looked at Acts 16. It was a group of women who were the first (recorded) recipients of the Good News of Jesus in Europe, down by the riverside, and it was Lydia who was the first to be baptised. And that reminded me of a brainstorm list that Eric Shumacher wrote (here and I have summarised below) to highlight the huge and pivotal significance women have been in God's story of salvation. Think about this:

The first thing declared 'not good' in creation was woman's absence. The first woman is named as being at enmity with the serpent because of her role in God's plan of salvation, for it is a woman who will give birth to the serpent-crushing Messiah. Hagar is the first and only character in the Old Testament to give a name to God. Women act bravely at decisive moments thus preserving the line of the Messiah - Tamar, Hebrew midwives, Rahab, Ruth, and Esther amongst them. Elizabeth and Mary are the first to believe that Jesus and his forerunner soon would be conceived and the first to speak aloud of it. (Unlike Zechariah who disbelieved and became mute.) Elizabeth and her bump(!) are the first recorded people to recognize the Messiah's arrival. Mary sings the New Testament's praise song and later is the first to expect and request a miraculous sign at the wedding in Cana. The woman at the well is the first recorded Gentile to recognize Jesus as the Messiah, and the first to go tell a community about him. Only women are said to give general, regular financial provision (out of their own means) to Jesus and the Twelve. No woman is ever recorded as acting against Jesus. Women were the last to stay with Jesus at the cross, along with just one male disciple. Mary is the final person Jesus directly ministered to before his death. Women were the first tasked with proclaiming news of the resurrection, and the first to see the resurrected Lord, and touch his resurrected body. Mary Magdalene is the first to hear the resurrected Lord's voice. Women being mistreated and overlooked is the motivation for appointing the first deacons of the church. Of Paul's four greetings that include specific names, a woman's name is listed first in three of them. A female voice is the last to be quoted in the Bible: The Spirit and the Bride say, "Come."

It's an amazing list, and in light of the treatment of women over many years in society and the life of the church it's worth noting. And it doesn't even include Lydia, Phoebe, Dorcas and Prsicilla and others in scripture. And it doesn't include the many women who have been faithful servants of Jesus at St Peter's and St Leonards over the years and today, without whom everything would have fallen apart. And for all of them we praise God and pray that He will continue to raise up women of faith for the work of the Kingdom!
