A message from Ruth

It wasn't supposed to be like this...

I wonder how often you, like me, have either muttered this under your breath, or screamed it from your heart? 'It wasn't supposed to be like this...' can be exasperation at a cake burnt on the edges and raw in the middle, or the cry of an exhausted parent holding a baby who refuses to settle, or a grieving relative bewildered at the loss of a loved one.

My job can involve sitting with people who utter those words, left hopeless by the circumstances in which they find themselves.

There is much that the Bible says to us when we find ourselves feeling battered and defeated by the road we are walking and it is important to recall those learned verses. It is a discipline to repeat the promises of God and to hold fast to them, even in the darkness.

But this week, I have been struck by the importance of acknowledging the pain, not trying to tidy it up, or reduce it in some way. Those times of frustration, loss and despair are genuine, often life impacting and hard.

Jesus was a man of compassion, meeting people at their point of need - no casual platitudes or 'look on the bright side' comments that are so often a part of our conversation are recorded as being his words.

The Bible tells us that it *wasn't* meant to be like this and offers us the sure and certain hope of a new heaven and new earth, a new order of things that <u>will</u> be the way that it was meant to be. Until then, I believe that we are called often to simply sit with those whose current experience has left them reflecting that it wasn't supposed to be like this... offering them, even in the silence, the love and compassion that Jesus showed to those he met in similarly dark places.

BLTHYSWOOD CARE SHOEBOX APPEAL




