A message from Duncan

I love that so much of scripture is narrative.

I mean, there's a bit of me that doesn't, I admit, because I am often looking for the 'right answer', and narrative never gives absolute, definitive answers we can prove. What it does do, however, is invite us in to explore, to think, to discover, to question and to wonder with God; and that is much better for us than having the answers at the back of the textbook! Rather, we are given wisdom, and that is true treasure.

I was reminded of this following our time in Daniel on Sunday. We compared his resistance of the King's food in Babylon to Jehoiachin (the last King of Judah) ending his days released from prison, clothed by the King of Babylon and feasting at his table. You can read the account in 2 Kings 25.27-30. Is this an example of the grace of God in the time of exile or is it the final evidence of Jehoiachin's compromise, concluding a long narrative of corruption and decay in the state of the nation of Israel? I was initially convinced by the latter: Daniel passes the test of faithfulness but Jehoiachin fails. I remain convinced. The charge of Daniel chapter one, for followers of Jesus, is to emulate Daniel's faithfulness, not hope for Jehoiachin's compromised comfort. There is, however, more going on. That's the beauty of narrative, there can be multiple threads of truth in the one tapestry. You see, Jehoiachin is also known as Jeconiah in scripture (see 1 Chron 3.15-17). He is the last surviving king in the line of David, and he is saved from death in exile, so that he might continue that line; the line that leads to Jesus, the Saviour of the world. Jeconiah has a named place in Jesus' family tree (see Matthew 1.11-12)! In the mess and chaos of exile, amidst human rebellion and faithlessness to the One who made them, God never gives

up. His plan to rescue his creation and his image bearers will never be thwarted even in the darkest times of history.

And that is grace! The persistent, unshakeable, undivertable, unquenchable grace of God. And that gives me hope in my life. But more than that, even in our days, it gives me hope for the world.

So God's grace be with you all,



SHAPED BY THE WORD: Daniel and chapter 7

Sunday by Sunday we hear a sermon. It's relatively short (historically speaking!) and is intended to nourish us, giving us some food to sustain us in our walk with Jesus during the week ahead. There is, however, little opportunity to discuss our questions or probe a little deeper into the strange but wonderful world of the Bible, and so grow in our understanding of God and his ways that we might be more conformed to his image. That is the idea behind **Shaped by the Word** evenings. Every so often we will take a Sunday evening to dig deeper into a Bible book or theme. This month, on **20th October at 6.30pm** we will look at the **book of Daniel, and focus in on Chapter 7**. It will be interactive with opportunities for discussion and questions and will finish no later than 8pm. The evening will be much better if you are there!
