A message from Duncan

Jesus said to them, "Let us go across to the other side of the lake."

Luke 8.22

Let us go across to the other side...

I wonder what the 'other side' is for you at the moment? Perhaps you have a particularly busy spell in your calendar, a convergence of responsibilities with deadlines arriving all at the same time. Maybe you are in the middle of health issues; or you're coping with challenges in your family, with colleagues or friends; or you are in the process of important life decisions that need to be made. Perhaps it's a situation you know you are going to have to live with for a long time; the other side seems in the far distance, way below the horizon.

Many will recognise the text above as from the story of Jesus asleep in the boat. It is one I keep coming back to. Occasionally I pester you with it along with the Jules Joseph Maynier's painting I love. Those who received Home Communion this week had to put up with me wittering about it.



There are lots of questions I still have concerning the story. Should Jesus have left the disciples to their own devices? Should I follow Jesus' example and sleep more?! Should I ignore the trials of life and pretend they're not real? With Jesus in the boat should I smile at the storm (as the old chorus goes)?

Jesus, as was his custom, had a question of his own: "Where is your faith?" (v25). I guess, if Jesus said, "Let's go to the other side" the disciples should have trusted that they would get there, no matter what. Perhaps they still needed to trim the rigging and bail out the boat, but they would get there. Maybe it wouldn't be pretty, but they would make it.

So whatever we face, however far the shore seems, let's invite Jesus into the boat, even if he insists on sleeping, because with him we *will* get to the other side.

Grace, peace and hope be strong in you all through Christ.



SHAPED BY THE WORD: Daniel and chapter 7

Sunday by Sunday we hear a sermon. It's relatively short (historically speaking!) and is intended to nourish us, giving us some food to sustain us in our walk with Jesus during the week ahead. There is, however, little opportunity to discuss our questions or probe a little deeper into the strange but wonderful world of the Bible, and so grow in our understanding of God and his ways that we might be more conformed to his image. That is the idea behind **Shaped by the Word** evenings. Every so often we will take a Sunday evening to dig deeper into a Bible book or theme. This month, on **20th October at 6.30pm** we will look at the **book of Daniel, and focus in on Chapter 7**. It will be interactive with opportunities for discussion and questions and will finish no later than 8pm. The evening will be much better if you are there!
