A message from Duncan

As I write this, just before All Saints Day, I am enjoying the beauty and colour of autumn. It is the first time the air has had that crisp chill that makes a walk bracing and a warm homecoming welcome. As I was enjoying autumn air, and wondering what we are meant to learn about God from this season when I was reminded of the Feast of Tabernacles - (I know, I'm odd).

We thought about this last of the feasts in the Hebrew year at our Harvest services. When you hear 'tabernacle' just think 'tent'(Leviticus 23.33-44). For seven days the people of God were to live in tents, woodland bivouacs really as they had to make them from branches and leaves. It was celebrated well after the warmth of the summer had dissipated so it may have been a little chilly some years. They would certainly have been pleased when, on the eighth day, they stepped back into their more resilient, permanent homes. This, of course, was exactly the point. In their tents they remembered their wilderness wanderings following which they were established in the Promised Land. The feast was to help them remember God's works in the past, but also to look forward to the ultimate fulfilment of the promise in Christ. I wonder whether Paul was thinking of the Feast of Tabernacles when he describes our mortal bodies as 'tents' (2 Corinthians 5.1-5). They are vulnerable, impermanent and the weather increasingly gets in! But the hope we have in Christ is for 'our eternal house in heaven.' What a contrast! What a hope.

The church of God got to embody this truth in the Old Testament. But we can too. Next time you step out of the cold into a warm home with solid walls and a damp



proof course, thank the Lord for our New Creation inheritance won by Christ and kept for us in heaven until just the right time.

And while we wait, pop on a scarf!


