A message from Duncan

This has been a week in which many of us have carried a heavy heart.

A damning report into a prolific child abuser associated with the Church of England, and the subsequent secrecy and failure of clergy to report the abuse, has been published leaving the country shocked and appalled. It will have been most difficult for those abused who have had to relive the pain they have carried for so many years. I cannot imagine the impact it has had on their lives and we pray for God's grace to carry them, and their families, at this time.

This has led to the resignation of Archbishop Justin. Statements from the Archbishops of Canterbury and York, and the Lead Bishop for safeguarding in the Church of England can be read here.

There will be many things which will need to be said and done as a result of this report: a lot of soul searching, honest appraisals of the culture of our churches, a rigorous evaluation of CofE safeguarding procedures. There will also be a time to look forward with hope and faith.

But first we need to sit without words; to measure the weight of this moment; to allow the enormity of it to impress itself upon us, to grieve the gravity of human sin and its evil destructiveness, to lament: this is our humanity, this happened in *our* Church of England, and for many of us, in our corner of the Church of England.

Our studies in Daniel this term will not continue beyond chapter 7. But in chapter 9, Daniel prays a staggering prayer. He was a blameless man before God that none could find fault with. In fact his political adversaries had to manipulate the

king to ensure Daniel's integrity ensnared him in a legal loophole. Yet, as he considers the history of his own people, their sin and their rejection of their covenant relationship with Yahweh, he owns it himself and utters these words (v9): "Lord, you are righteous, but this day we are covered with shame."

This day we are covered with shame and cry: Lord have mercy.


