A message from Duncan

Stir up, we beseech thee, O Lord, the wills of thy faithful people; that they, plenteously bringing forth the fruit of good works, may of thee be plenteously rewarded; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

This is the last Book of Common Prayer Collect of the Church year. It is the traditional cue to begin preparing your fruit-filled Christmas pudding. Or is it your Christmas cake?

Observing the Church year has many advantages. One of which is, from time to time, to draw our thoughts, away from the complexity of contemporary life back to Christ and his eternal plan of salvation that will far outlast the latest headlines. This is not to say we are to bury our heads in the sand or address current issues, but that amidst it all we need to be called back to faithful discipleship in our everyday lives. There's plenty to be concerned about in our nation and world, but much of it, in reality, is out of our control. What *is* in our control are the multiple decisions we make each day that will *'plenteously bring forth the fruit of good works.'*

That fruit is beautifully expressed in Galatians 5 and will be well known to many of you, *"Love, joy, peace, patience..." etc.* (v22-23). That fruit is not something that we produce of ourselves. It is the Spirit who ripens it in our lives (v22), but we do co-operate. As we *'serve one another in love'* and *'love our neighbour as ourselves'* (v13-14) - i.e. the *'good works'* of our collect - the Spirit is given room to produce his fruit in our lives. And upon the appearance of this fruit, which the Spirit produces, it is *we* who are *'plenteously rewarded'*. Such is the beautiful grace of our Saviour!

And the stirring up for which we pray is often provided by the encouragement of church fellowship. As the writer of Hebrews puts it: "*Let us consider how we may stir*

one another on towards love and good deeds." (10.24). So consider yourself stirred up, and I will expect a degree of the same from you all!
