Shaped by the Word recording and notes

A message from Duncan

We are just a few days from the beginning of the Advent season. For once the beginning coincides with the hallowed opening of windows and doors of brightly coloured calendars on 1st December. Back in my day (am I really beginning to say things like that!) we would reuse the same calendar year upon year. In some ways that tradition is a true reminder that, in the Church year, we are at the beginning again, back where we started.

This has often left me with a little pang of longing, for Jesus has still not returned and we are about to do the whole thing again. However, our sojourning in Daniel 7 in our 'Shaped by the Word' sessions, has reminded me that it is no bad thing to revisit old haunts. Daniel receives a strange vision in that chapter (v2-14), and then returns to the same vision once for an interpretation (v17-18), and then twice more (v21-22 & 23-27) so that he might see the things he missed at first. He didn't understand it all at first.

Surely that is true of our Christian journey. We revisit the 'old, old story'; we return to familiar scripture; we rehearse the same routines, and each time have the opportunity to gaze again into ancient truth, ever new. Added to that, each time we find ourselves in a familiar place we realise that *we* are not the same as when we were there last. We inescapably see things from a new perspective. And with a different perspective we are able to see things we never saw before. TS Elliott eloquently suggests *'the end of all our exploring will be to arrive where we started and know the place for the first time.'*

So prepare to see or hear something new this Advent in your walk with Christ. Even though you may have been here many times before. The Psalmist exclaims in Psalm 119 *"I rejoice at your word like one who finds great treasure."* May you find cause to rejoice at God's word to you this Advent.
