# A message from Duncan

Epiphany is the season of light.

And don't we need it. I have felt the seasonal lethargy and reluctance to go out into the dark evenings this week. Indeed, one evening I emerged from a meeting in Cassington into a dark night and a thick fog to boot. No wonder hibernation tendencies and January blues begin to kick in! It is a time of year when we realise how closely our physical environment affects our spiritual and emotional life.

Epiphanytide stands out in defiance and hope, and puts the steel in us for the same. We light a candle in the darkness. Isaiah 60 is used throughout the season, often as a canticle or a response: "See, darkness covers the earth, and thick darkness is over the peoples" That about sums it up, I can relate to that. But then the gospel: "but the Lord rises upon you and his glory appears over you." and the even more arresting: "Arise, shine, for your light has come". Oddly the two seem to be present simultaneously in these verses: darkness and light. I guess most of us can relate to that as well. Being a Christian does not mean all is sweetness and delight. In fact we are to expect the opposite, or at least the likelihood of the opposite, if we are listening to Jesus carefully. But the call is also to hold onto the light. And we must call it out to each other in the church: Arise, shine, for your light has come! Not in the sense of 'look on the bright side for a change, cheer up', but in a deeper, more existential sense: the proclamation of a profound, cosmos altering truth that became real in a Bethlehem manger.

And that is what church is, or should be: a place where we call to each other this truth: *your light has come, so* arise and shine and give God the glory!

So perhaps, every so often in Ephiphanytide, take the time to light a candle and say the simple but well-loved prayer:

Lighten our darkness, we beseech thee, O Lord
And by thy great mercy
Defend us from all perils and dangers of this night;
For the love of thy only Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ.
Amen.
