A message from Duncan

Every so often I take the opportunity of a newswire message to extol the benefits of the Collects of the Church of England. For those who don't know, a collect is a short prayer, often reflecting the week or season of the Church year, that 'collects' together all the prayers of God's people. There is a Collect set each Sunday for the week ahead. This prayer is then repeated in the Daily office (short times of bible reading and prayer) unless a Principal Feast, Holy Day, Festival or Lesser Festival falls on one of the days of that week, in which case there is a specific collect which will be used on that day, as well as for Evening Prayer the day before. (I know, I'm lost now as well!)

If you, like me, go through seasons when it is a real struggle to force yourself to sit down (or stand up / kneel down) to pray each day I would heartily suggest simply praying the Collect for the week with the Lord's prayer. We always print the Collect on the Sunday morning "Join us" email or you can find them <u>here</u>. I grew up in a church tradition where there were no written down prayers used in worship, but since my childhood I have found set prayers immensely helpful, precisely because prayer is not easy - sometimes we just need to get on and do it. Someone encouraged me when preparing for ordination by saying, "Duncan, when you find you can't pray, that is the time to say your prayers." I wholeheartedly agree.

And so I end with the Collect for the Fourth Sunday of Epiphany which beautifully sums up the theme which has accompanied our meditations of the last few weeks. I also include it because we will not officially use it this year - the fourth week also being the Feast day of the Presentation of Jesus in the Temple (lost again?) and I didn't want you to miss out! Pray it with me now and add a faith filled, "Amen - let it be so."

God our creator, who in the beginning commanded the light to shine out of darkness: we pray that the light of the glorious gospel of Christ may dispel the darkness of ignorance and unbelief, shine into the hearts of all your people, and reveal the knowledge of your glory in the face of Jesus Christ your Son our Lord. Amen.

Collect for the Presentation of Christ in the Temple

Almighty and ever-living God, clothed in majesty, whose beloved Son was this day presented in the Temple, in substance of our flesh: grant that we may be presented to you with pure and clean hearts, by your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.



Pastoral Visiting Team

For some time there has been a desire for a team of Pastoral Visitors to both maximise the pastoral support we can offer one another in the Benefice and ensure those who are caring for others are well supported and equipped themselves. Electoral Rolls - Every parish holds an electoral roll, which is the Anglican way of recording church membership. This year we are required to produce new electoral rolls for both Cassington and Eynsham parishes. In the next few weeks we will be contacting everyone on the existing rolls and providing forms that you **must** complete if you wish to stay on the electoral roll. If you have not previously been on the electoral roll, we will also be providing on-line and paper forms for you to join if you wish.





Gatehouse was set up 40 years ago by the churches in and around Oxford, initially to provide a drop-in café for people who were sleeping on the streets, plus clothing and bedding for them. Nowadays it also supports individuals and families who are vulnerably housed, or in food poverty. It also provides an advice

service.

Once every six weeks it is Eynsham's turn to make donations. Members of all three churches bake cakes, make sandwiches, or give shop bought food. Anything that can be used in the café is welcome. We also welcome clothes and shoes (especially men's), bedding and sleeping bags and rucksacks.

Volunteers deliver items to my house, 15 Newland St, between 9 am and 1 pm on 'our' Sunday. The Rotarians then deliver everything to Gatehouse. Jennifer Clarke organises this for St Leonard's and knows the schedule jenniferclarke362@gmail.com
