A message from Duncan

Time's they are a'changing.

It has been increasingly difficult to keep up with the latest piece of startling news that reminds us we are living through unprecedented times and experiencing tectonic shifts in international relations, politics and culture. There is much cause for concern, whatever your perspective. And, as is the case with so many things in our age, the pace of that change has been disorientating. There is much to be praying for.

And prayer is a good idea. We know it is a gift to us by which we petition God to intervene, or simply to lament and despair in his presence. But at times like these it also, and perhaps most significantly, offers us the opportunity to see things from his perspective. Firstly the Lord invites us into a posture of humility, proclaiming in Isaiah 55, 'For as the heavens are higher than the earth, So are My ways higher than your ways, And My thoughts than your thoughts.' He also invites us to fix ourselves on those higher ways, through the Apostle Paul this time: "Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth." (Colossians 3.2). He also encourages us to have the long view: "the things that are seen are transient, but the things that are unseen are eternal." (2 Corinthians 4.18) In the Age to Come it will be interesting to see what has lasted from the machinations of humanity and what is swept away in the wind. There will be plenty of surprises.

But most of all prayer allows us to surrender to God: to let go of our anxieties, to acknowledge our profound limitations in this life, and to trust him. In fact, if you find yourself worrying I heartily recommend prayerfully reading Isaiah 40. You will find your eyes lifted to a more certain place, your perspective restored and your

hope renewed; in fact you will find yourself soaring on wings like eagles. And that is a good vantage point to see things a little more clearly.


